

PARKING ORDINANCE ALBANY, NH

The Town of Albany, N.H. parking ordinance is hereby amended. The Carroll County Sheriff's Department and the New Hampshire State Police are empowered to enforce these regulations with the imposition of fines established by the Board of Selectmen.

Emergency Conditions: When in the judgement of the Sheriff, Deputy Sheriffs, State Police Officers or Fire Chief, an emergency situation is deemed to exist on roadways or places designated for no parking, and the area must be cleared for access by emergency vehicles, authority is granted for the removal of the illegally parked vehicles and other vehicles deemed an obstruction.

Definitions:

Road or Highway: The entire width between boundary lines of every public way or place used by the public for vehicular traffic.

Crosswalk: Any portion of the roadway distinctly indicated for pedestrian walking by lines or other markings on the surface.

Fire Lane: The portion of the travelled way established on private property, devoted to public use, where the parking of motor vehicles or other obstructions may interfere with ingress and egress of the fire department or other emergency vehicles used for the protection of person and property, such as shopping centers, churches, or other similar locations.

Intersection: The area bounded by the prolongation of the lateral curb lines or the lateral boundary lines of two highways.

Right-of-Way: The privilege of the immediate use of the road.

Roadway: The portion of the street designed or ordinarily used for vehicular travel.

Sidewalk: The portion of the street between curb lines and adjacent property lines, intended for pedestrian use.

Vehicle: Every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway.

Motor Vehicle: Every vehicle that is self-propelled.

Authorized Emergency Vehicle: Fire and police department vehicles and such other vehicles as are designated as such by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles or the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Albany, N.H.

Traffic: Pedestrians, draft animals, cattle, sheep, goats, vehicles, or other conveyances while using the street for the purpose of travel.

Travel Portion of road: Any part of the road customarily used for vehicular travel.

No Parking Zone: Area in which no parking is allowed.

No Parking: On the travel portion (pavement) of Passaconaway Rd. from 1000 feet East of the Moat Mountain Trail Head Parking area to the Kancamagus Highway. The tires of all vehicles must be completely off the pavement.

If a vehicle is found on the travel portion (pavement) or is found to be blocking and/or obstructing traffic flow or is a danger to the motoring public, the vehicle may be towed at the owner's expense in the judgement of the enforcement officer.

No Parking: On the travel portion (pavement) of the Kancamagus Highway that would impede the flow of traffic; example – being parked over the white line, or anywhere within the area customarily used for travel.

No Parking: On either side of Moat View Drive—from Kancamagus Highway to Swift River Circle.

Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with law, or the direction of a police officer or other official traffic control device, no person shall park in the following locations NH RSA 265:69.

Parking with rear wheels to curb	\$35.00
Parking on travel portion of roadway	\$50.00 first offense/\$100.00 2 nd /3 rd offense
Parking so as to block winter snow removal	\$50.00 first offense/\$100.00 2 nd /3 rd offense

NOTE: 2nd offense and 3rd offense shall be within 12 months of the calendar year of the first offense.

This section of fines and penalties is granted by RSA: 41:11-b

If payment of fines is not received within five (5) business days after the date of the ticket, the Carroll County Sheriff's Department will follow through with a letter to the violator advising that a court summons will be issued if the fine remains unpaid.

This amended ordinance shall take effect on June 20, 2018, per order of the Albany, Board of Selectmen.
